Willson Powell—Chairman of the SCAHF Board of Directors, will follow at Oak Grove Hall, home of Mr. and Mrs. William Cross of Newberry, SC. Oak Grove Hall was designed for Major Frederick Nance, between 1820 and 1825 by South Carolina's very own Robert Mills.

The annual meeting will provide an update regarding the progress and activities of both the Archives and History Center as well as the progress of the Foundation. There will be a special presentation given by Dr. Rodger Stroup, Director of the Department of Archives and History on upcoming events and tours.

The Chairman's Reception will be held from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at Oak Grove Hall located at 921 Jessica Avenue, Newberry, SC.
