Houses the records of the Episcopal bishops and other diocesan governing bodies, programs, and staff, dating back to the separation from the Diocese of South Carolina in 1922. Also houses records for the Episcopal parishes and mission churches administered in the 20-county Upstate and Midlands areas of South Carolina, some of which pre-date the diocese of 1922. Typical records include bishops' correspondence and other writings, diocesan council records, trustee records, standing committee records, accounting and trust fund records, property records, marital judgements, confirmations, parish officer lists, and parish histories and directories. Under canon law, active parishes are responsible for maintaining their own sacramental records related to marriages, deaths, confirmations, and burials.
